The Coalition’s goal is for all contracted centers and family child care homes to become models for Early Learning for all providers in Florida, by joining Sunshine Stars.

Sunshine Stars – Pasco Hernando’s Quality Rating Improvement System

Sunshine Stars is a voluntary rating system that reviews early learning programs according to clearly defined, high quality standards. Sunshine Stars utilizes a five (5) star rating system that evaluates and offers support and training to assist providers in reaching their goals. Sunshine Stars is a Quality Rating Improvement System for School Readiness providers contracted in Pasco and Hernando Counties with the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties. Sunshine Stars now has a multi-phase improvement system, where Phase 1 is for the first two years, and upon successful completion, providers are eligible to participate in Phase 2. This two-year commitment is based on Phase 1 values and provides additional areas for growth and quality.

Sunshine Stars is different from child care licensing, accreditation and the Office of Early Learning and the School Readiness Monitoring Tool. Child care licensing regulations are basic requirements that must be met in order to be a legally operating child care program. Accreditation, whether Gold Seal, NAEYC or other affiliated program, represents an achievement of quality, typically through self-study and verification, yet does not focus on **continuous quality improvement**. Sunshine Stars will assist willing providers by offering a comprehensive system of rating and support for **quality improvement** that will help create high quality early learning programs. The support in quality improvement is critical to addressing your program’s strengths and needs in order to improve the quality of care and education being offered to the children enrolled in your programs.

Sunshine Stars will provide a rating of quality using a 5-star system similar to those used by hotel websites. A 5-star rating will indicate the highest quality programs. Becoming a participant in Sunshine Stars will also afford programs additional guidance and support toward attaining quality improvement.

The rating can be a useful tool for providers, as well as for families who are deciding where to enroll their children in care. Once your program has earned its stars, this information may be posted on your website and published in your newsletter to parents. The Coalition will also provide information on star rated providers to parents who are seeking this information through the Resource & Referral process, as well as post star ratings on our website and social media pages.

Vision:

To create a high quality, market-based approach to Early Learning programs in Pasco and Hernando counties.

Mission:

To raise the quality of our early learning centers by identifying strengths and weaknesses within the programs to allow for coaching, professional development and technical assistance.

Goals:

1. Continuous improvement of early learning centers;
2. Parent awareness of quality centers;
3. Create a path toward quality that will increase family engagement and community knowledge

Expectations for Providers and Coalition:

The Expectations of **participating providers** for “Sunshine Stars” include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Commitment to continuous quality
2. Cooperation with coalition in completion of Sunshine Stars
3. Completing all required paperwork and submitting same in a timely manner
4. Implementing the Quality Improvement Plan as outlined by Provider Specialist
5. Displaying the Sunshine Stars banner

The expectations of the **Pasco Hernando Early Learning Coalition** for “Sunshine Stars” include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Ensuring quality programs
2. Respecting and supporting families
3. Supporting programs through training, coaching, technical assistance and development of a Quality Improvement Plan supervised by a Provider Specialist
4. Completing Evaluations in a timely manner
5. Validating and presenting CEU’s for completed training
6. Awarding of stars for successful completion of Sunshine Stars program in a timely manner

Quality Standards and Star Rating:

The Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties will have its Sunshine Stars focus on three (3) standards during the first phase (Phase 1) (a two-year period):

- Staff Qualifications and Professional Development
- Learning Environment
- Teacher-Child Interactions
 - a. Infant CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System)
 - b. Toddler CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System)
 - c. Pre-K CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System)

Phase 2 (a two-year period) will include the above and will add:

- Family Engagement

The Center-Based Program and Family Child Care Home Validation Checklist will be available in the manual appendix and on the Coalition's website – www.phelc.org/QRIS.php

Sunshine Stars Rating Process

Depending on the outcome of your assessment score totals, your program will receive a Star Rating consisting of **5-stars, 4-stars, 3-stars, 2-stars or 1-star.**

Your star rating will be good for two (2) years and a Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) will be designed specifically for your programs. These are your options:

1. Publish your star rating as it stands
2. Publish your star rating and begin a Quality Improvement Plan which shall not exceed six months
3. Hold off on publishing your star rating until the completion of your Quality Improvement Plan which shall not exceed six months

The Coalition will also include your program's star rating for parents requesting such information through the Resource and Referral process.

If at any time during the two year period your program is monitored by DCF or the Coalition's Provider Specialist and found to have a Class I violation, your star rating will be revoked until further notice. Please see pg. 17 under Stipulations for a full explanation. Reapplication is possible after one year.

Benefits to Providers

Support services programs will include:

- **Technical Assistance for Quality Improvement:** Each Sunshine Stars program participant will be assigned a Provider Specialist (PS) who is dedicated to supporting the program during the quality improvement process and beyond. The Provider Specialist will work closely with your program staff, specifically your teaching staff, to develop a Quality Improvement Plan (QIP). The QIP is a guide that will outline the additional goals and action plans that may be utilized in order to promote a quality-based learning environment for the children in your program.
- **Career Advisement:** Coalition Staff will help program participants identify what is needed to increase knowledge, skills and qualifications for staff members teaching in early learning and education settings.
- **Educational Training:** Sunshine Stars and the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties will provide trainings on a variety of topics designed to increase the classroom knowledge of your teachers. Coalition Staff will work with your program staff members to help them develop a plan to meet their educational goals.
- **Recognition/Marketing/Advertising:** Banners will be provided to centers that have achieved their stars (upgrading will yield an updated banner). These may be displayed outside the center and used as a marketing and advertising tool. The ratings are also beneficial when placed on the center's website. They will appear on the Coalition's website for parents to view.

The Process

Eligibility

Any licensed child care facility including religious exempt child care centers, and family child care homes are eligible to participate in Sunshine Stars. In order to be eligible to participate, however, a program must meet the following criteria:

- Hold a School Readiness Provider Contract with the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties and have a program based in Pasco and/or Hernando County.
- Be in good standing with an applicable School Readiness Contract.
- Be in good standing with the Department of Children and Families/Child Care Licensing or other accredited licensing agency.
- Meet Sunshine Stars Licensing Policy:
 - a. Zero (0) Class 1 licensing violations within the last 12 months;
 - b. No more than two (2) of the same Class 2 licensing violations within the last 12 months in the same category.

Programs must meet Sunshine Stars Licensing Policy and have been in operation for one year. More clearly, one (1) year from the last disqualifying violation (assuming there were no additional violations during that period). Once a School Readiness Provider, application can be made immediately. If a program has not been operating with an active license for at least one year, it will be eligible one year from the active date. If a program is ineligible due to operating on a probationary license, it will be eligible once it obtains an annual license.

The Application

The Sunshine Stars application form may be found on the Coalition's website under Sunshine Stars– www.phelc.org/QRIS.php (Please see sample of Phase 1 application on page 10, Phase 2 application on page 25)

All participants are required to fill out the application form – either online directly through the website, print out the form and fax, scan and email, or drop the completed form off at the Coalition's main office in Spring Hill.

After the Coalition has received and verified the information supplied on the application, providers will be notified within 3-5 business days of receipt of the application, as to whether or not they are eligible to participate in Sunshine Stars.

Our timeliness to your evaluation is dependent upon staffing and funding. Terms of agreement are **for two (2) years**, from the star award date, wherein the program and Coalition will work together to complete the process.

Application Summary:

Assessment Tool Summary for Center Based Programs

S1.1 - Staff Qualifications: 5 points possible. This standard will give evidence of center's staff certifications and educational levels. For the Director, this should include DCF Training Transcript (within last 12 months). Also, 100% of the instructional staff will be reviewed to show documentation of high school diploma or GED, and up to date DCF Training Transcript. The standards designate how many points will be achieved depending upon training and educational levels.

S.1.2 - Professional Development: 5 points possible. The Director will document the number of in-service hours that have been completed by staff and Director. 100% of the instructional staff files will be selected for review of completed in-service training.

S.2.1 - Learning Environment (Quality Environment Assessment): 15 points possible. This standard will recognize providers who maintain an environment where experiences are developmentally appropriate and have been created with the child's needs in mind. This includes center set up, curriculum implementation, individualized lesson plans and developmentally appropriate materials.

S.3 - Teacher-Child Interactions (Classroom Assessment Scoring System): 10 total points possible for Toddler Classrooms. This dimension recognizes providers who have developed meaningful relationships and who understand how powerful they are and how effective interactions impact children's development and learning. Emotional and Behavioral Support refers to specific teaching behaviors that help children develop warm, supportive relationships, experience enjoyment and excitement about learning, feel comfortable in the classroom, experience appropriate levels of autonomy or independence, develop behavioral regulations, meet behavioral expectations, and fully participate in classroom activities. Engaged Support for Learning refers to specific teaching behaviors that include the facilitation of activities that enhance children's thinking, reasoning, and verbal skills, build their knowledge of the world, and encourage persistence, attention and motivation.

At the Pre-K level: 15 points possible. Emotional Support refers to behaviors that help children develop warm, supportive relationships, experience enjoyment and excitement about learning, feel comfortable in the classroom and experience appropriate levels of autonomy or independence. Classroom Organization describes specific teaching behaviors that help children develop skills to regulate their own behavior, get the most learning out of the day, and maintain interest in learning activities. Instructional Support refers to specific teaching behaviors that help support children's cognitive development and language growth.

S.4 Family Engagement (For Phase 2 Providers): 5 points possible. Child Development occurs in a variety of environments including family, culture, community, and learning centers. Effective Early Learning Programs use both the general and family-specific practices to ensure that all families become engaged in their child's early learning and development. This standard will recognize providers who have developed meaningful connections with families to form active partnerships in the child's learning.

Assessment Tool Summary for Family Child Care Homes

S.1 - Staff Qualifications: 5 points possible. This standard will give evidence of center's staff certifications and educational levels. For the Director, this should include DCF Training Transcript (within last 12 months). Also, 100% of the instructional staff will be reviewed to show documentation of high school diploma or GED, and up to date DCF Training Transcript. The standards designate how many points will be achieved depending upon training and educational levels.

S.1.2 - Professional Development: 5 points possible. The Director will document the number of in-service hours that have been completed by staff and Director. 100% of the instructional staff files will be selected for review of completed in-service training.

S.2.1 - Learning Environment (Quality Environment Assessment): 15 points possible. This standard will recognize providers who maintain an environment where experiences are developmentally appropriate and have been created with the children's needs in mind. This includes: center set up, curriculum implementation, individualized lesson plans, and developmentally appropriate materials.

S.3 - Teacher-Child Interactions (Classroom Assessment Scoring System): 10 total points possible for Toddler Classrooms. This dimension recognizes providers who have developed meaningful relationships and who understand how powerful they are and how effective interactions impact children's development and learning. Emotional and Behavioral Support refers to specific teaching behaviors that help children develop warm, supportive relationships, experience enjoyment and excitement about learning, feel comfortable in the classroom, experience appropriate levels of autonomy or independence, develop behavioral regulations, meet behavioral expectations, and fully participate in classroom activities. Engaged Support for Learning refers to specific teaching behaviors that include the facilitation of activities that enhance children's thinking, reasoning, and verbal skills, build their knowledge of the world, and encourage persistence, attention and motivation.

In the Pre-K Classroom – 15 total points possible. Emotional Support refers to the specific teaching behaviors that help children develop warm, supportive relationships, experience enjoyment and excitement about learning, feel comfortable in the classroom and experience appropriate levels of autonomy or independence. Classroom Organization describes specific teaching behaviors that help children develop skills to regulate their own behavior, get the most learning out of each day, and maintain interest in learning activities. Instructional Support refers to specific teaching behavior that helps support cognitive development and language growth.

S.4 Family Engagement (For Phase 2 Providers): 5 points possible. Child Development occurs in a variety of environments including family, culture, community, and learning centers. Effective Early Learning Programs use both the general and family-specific practices to ensure that all families become engaged in their child's early learning and development. This standard will recognize providers who have developed meaningful connections with families to form active partnerships in the child's learning.

Stipulations for Star Ratings

The Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties, Inc. and its program, Sunshine Stars of Pasco Hernando, reserve the right to take any action necessary for the betterment, preservation and validity of this initiative. The Coalition's Executive Director can initiate termination of the program at any time based on recommendations of Coalition staff or system partners AFTER the provider has received an opportunity to have a meeting for due process and explanation.

Grounds for immediate termination from Sunshine Stars

- One (1) Class 1 violation during the past 12 months
- Being placed on probationary status by DCF during the past 12 months
- Any other major DCF non-compliance issues which endanger the health and safety of children at the center
- No more than two (2) of the same Class 2 licensing violations within the last 12 months in the same category

Change in owner or locations

- If there is a change, notification by owner must be submitted to Coalition in writing within five (5) business days
- The star rating is non-transferrable to new owners or another location

Change in Director

- Must notify Coalition within five (5) days of change
- A Coalition staff member will visit facility to evaluate continued participation
- Re-application may be necessary

Limitations of Participation

- Participation is voluntary. Either party may discontinue participation, but should give the other thirty (30) days written notice. The Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties, Inc. will give prior notification and justification in the event that participation is to be terminated
- Participation in Sunshine Stars does not guarantee a high star level designation or allow the center/home to be eligible to waive county or state licensing
- Our timeliness of your participation is dependent upon our staffing and funding
- Terms of agreement/participation/tenure are for two (2) years in Phase 1. Providers can continue with a second application (see Appendix) for another two years for Phase 2. After the star rating is awarded, the Program and Coalition continue to work together

Reapplication

- Providers wishing to participate in Phase 2 must reapply using application in Appendix
- Providers that have had their Sunshine Stars revoked, may re-apply after one year

Quality Improvement and Reapplication Process

Quality Improvement Plan

All providers that have completed the Sunshine Stars Formal Validation and have received their Sunshine Stars rating can immediately begin their Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) if they wish to increase their star rating.

This process will encourage further Quality in provider programs and will foster increased star ratings. This will be accomplished through upgrading your scores on CLASS which in turn raises the number of stars your center earns. Provider Specialists will make periodic spot checks to give positive feedback on progress.

The Quality Improvement Plan should not exceed 6 months. The number of visits made by the Provider Specialist will depend on time, budget and necessity.

Process for Reapplication for Sunshine Stars

The Star designation shall be valid for a period of two years (24 months). Ninety days (90) before the expiration date, it will be the responsibility of the Provider to re-apply for Sunshine Stars. This can be done on-line or with the reapplication found in the Appendix of the Provider Manual. Once the reapplication has been filled out, it can be emailed to PHELC for review. The Coalition has 14 days to acknowledge the reapplication and inform the Provider of the next steps to take to complete the process.

It should be noted that a new application, evaluation and possible Quality Improvement Plan will be part of the reapplication process. Reapplication automatically begins Phase 2. Nothing carries over from the last contract. This is to ensure that quality has been maintained, or improved and technical assistance has moved Providers to a newer/higher/professional level.
