GOVERNOR RICK SCOTT APPOINTS THREE TO EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF PASCO AND HERNANDO COUNTIES INCLUDING NEW CHAIRSPERSON

Governor Rick Scott has appointed Dr. Steven N. Kanakis as Chairperson for the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties, Inc.

The Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties, Inc. is pleased to announce Governor Rick Scott's appointment of Dr. Steven Kanakis as Chair of Board of Directors for a three (3) year term beginning on January 31, 2014. Dr. Kanakis is a self-employed forensic psychologist in New Port Richey, Florida and long-time, accomplished board member for the Early Learning Coalition. He is considered an expert in the field of Clinical Psychology in adult criminal court, juvenile criminal court, dependency court, probate court, and family court. Dr. Kanakis also performs evaluations for disability determination, rehabilitation training, and learning disabilities.
